- 3. The AMAs are requested NOT to prescribe medicines for more than 10 days at a stretch in very beginning of the treatment. In course of 3 to 4 consultations, HE/she can reach to 20 days, i.e. maximum period of treatment.
- 4. The AMAs are further requested to strictly follow the rules and orders issued under CS (MA) Rules 1944 and to note the salient points set out in the same rules. A copy of "INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOCTORS" as in Appendix-XI of Medical Attendance Rules is enclosed.
- 5. A copy of O.M. No.S.14025/10/2001-MS dated 31-12-2002 of Ministry of Home Affairs and Family Welfare regarding Revision of Consultation/Visiting/Injection fees of AMAs is also enclosed for necessary action.

Sir/Madam,

It is to inform that during the monthly meeting of the Central Government Employees' Welfare Coordination Committee (CGEWCC) held on 30-11-2016, it was discussed that the AMAs at Mainland hospitals are charging as per the CGHS rates for consultation, treatment, laboratory tests, X-ray etc. for the central government employees and the same should be applicable for the central government employees posted in Port Blair and taking treatment from AMAs at this place.

- Hence, all the Authorized Medical Attendants appointed by the CGEWCC, Port Blair are requested to charge as per CGHS rates for consultation, treatment, laboratory tests, X-ray etc. for the central government employees posted at Port Blair with effect from 01-04-2017. They are also requested to enquire about the status of central government employees before giving the treatment and charge accordingly. The CGHS rates are available in the website https://drive.google.com/file/d/0B9OjCJTCunQqMXJ2eUR6bEpUYU0/view?pli=1 which may be downloaded and implemented.
- The AMAs are also requested to display the board mentioning as "Authorized AMA for the 3. Central Govt. employees" at their hospital.
- It is also to inform that as per the latest Govt. guidelines, the limit of ten days treatment at the consulting room of AMA may be increased to forty days if the treatment is taken in Indian system of Medicines and in Homoeopathy. The total number of consultations will, however, remain four at an interval of ten days (copy enclosed for reference). This may be implemented by all the AMAs.
